Discipleship Meeting Guide

You should strive to meet with your partner(s) on a regular and consistent basis - whatever is most beneficial, agreed upon, and realistic for your situation.

Here are some suggestions to guide your time together:

- Read part or all of a Psalm (a good method is to take the day and add 30 to give a selection of passages to choose from; i.e. on the 20th you can read Psalm 20, 50, 80, 110, or 140)
- Pray
- Share Scripture memory work
- Ask fellowship questions of each other, such as:
 - What is the best thing that has happened since our last meeting?
 - Any unusual burdens or troubles since our last meeting?
 - How is your ministry (however you serve the local church) going?
 - Where have you seen the Lord at work lately?
 - What has the Lord been teaching you?
 - Have you had any opportunities to share the Gospel?
 - Have you had any obvious answers to prayer?
 - Where have you been reading in the Bible and what impact has it had on you?
 - What are you passionate about right now?
- · Ask personal accountability questions of each other, such as:
 - Have you been with a member of the opposite sex in a way that might be considered compromising or questionable?
 - Have your financial dealings lacked integrity?
 - Have you spent adequate time in Bible reading and prayer?
 - Have you been meditating on, and not just reading, Scripture?
 - Have you given priority time to your family (if applicable)?
 - Have you lied in any of these answers?
- · Ask each other, "How can I pray for you?"
- Pray for one another.

Remember, the goal is not to get through all of the questions in a short amount of time or to answer them "correctly." Rather it is to encourage one another towards Christ-likeness through faithful devotion to the Word of God and a lifestyle worthy of the Gospel of Jesus, rooted in mission and worship.
